

Using a Reward Chart



A reward chart is aimed at encouraging a child to comply or to behave in a certain way.

A chart can last for a week, a day or just for a shorter time than that.

There will be a number of stars or tokens for a child to collect.

The chart will specify what a child needs to do in a positive way, for example, "Kind hands" as opposed to "no hitting."

If a child complies with the behaviour on the chart he/she will get a star.

A full chart may mean a tangible reward/treat to motivate them to continue to comply. Sometimes just getting the star is enough. (you know the child best)

Children may use reward charts at home but bring them in to show their teacher. Their teacher could then make a fuss of them/give them a reward in school.
